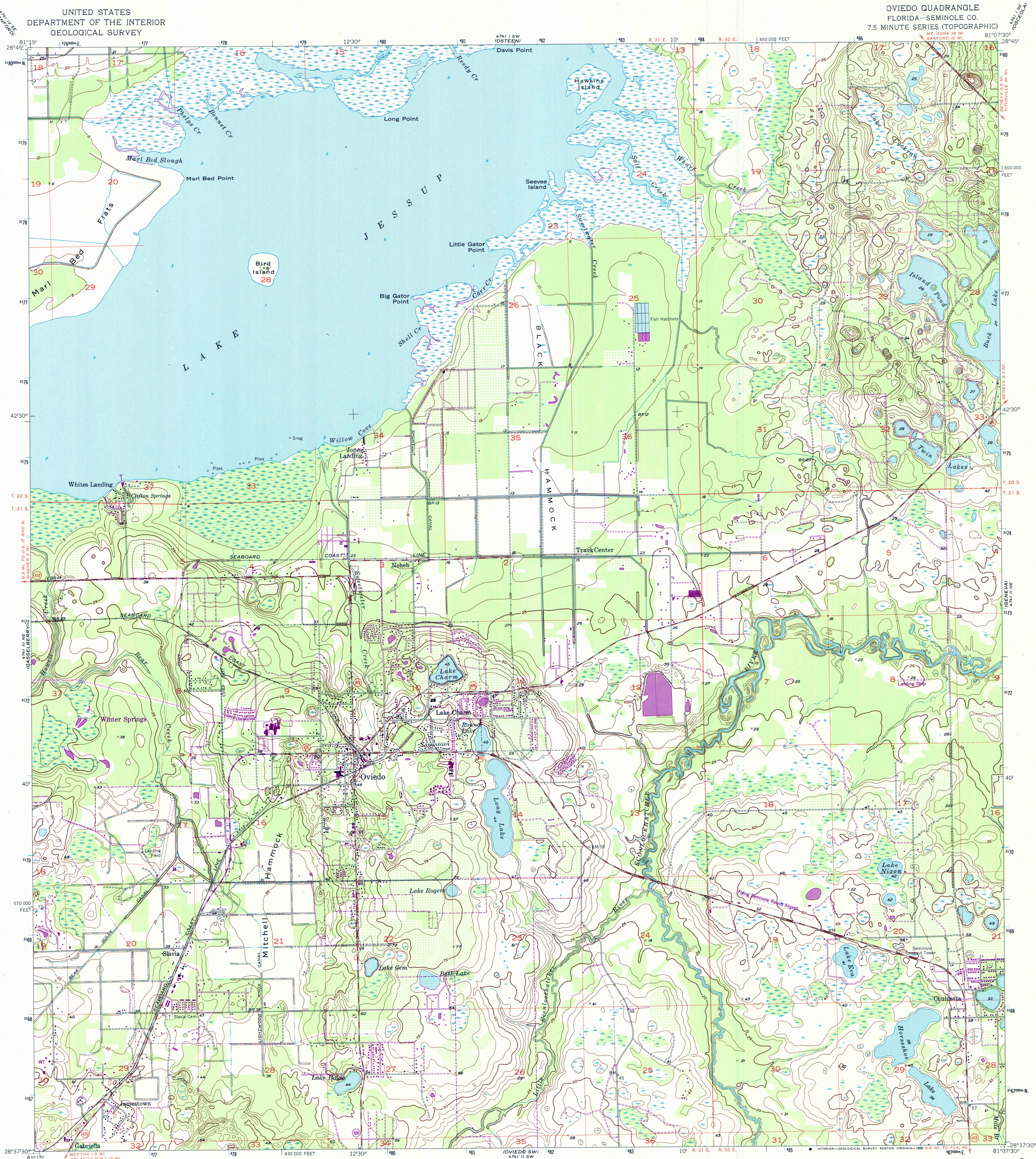

Revisions shown in purple compiled from aerial photographs

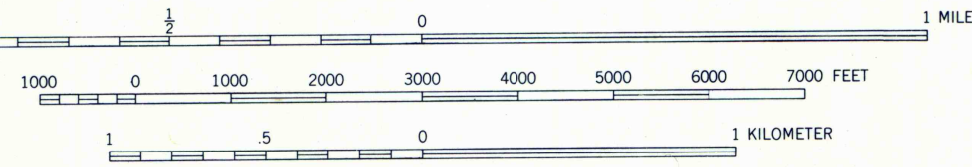
