PROJECT DESCRIPTION

1. Describe the project and explain how it will achieve the goals of Resolution 2000-156 and 2020-79 to plan for the future growth of Volusia County and enhance the quality of life for its residents (use factual information/documentation to show how project will accomplish these goals).

The Ormond Beach YMCA Aquatic and Park Project is a multi-phase project that directly aligns with Volusia ECHO and the endeavor to bring outdoor recreational opportunities to the residents of Volusia County. The project is creating unique recreational opportunities which are open to the public. The project began in 2014 with the expansion of the outdoor pool and the surrounding pool deck. We have completed construction on the expanded parking areas, the dog park, splash pad and playground, which is now all open to the public.

All features added over the length of this project are designed to enhance the experience for our users and expand the group of people we serve.

With a change of leadership and the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic, some of the portions of the Ormond Beach project, both within and outside of the scope of ECHO projects, have changed. The fitness trail which ECHO agreed to fund in 2019 was not completed in the required timeframe and those funds have been relinquished.

All additions and renovations from everyphase of the Ormond Beach YMCA Aquatic and Park Project are designed to offer programs and services that build a healthy spirit, mind, and body for all residents of Volusia County. Each improvement and addition to our programs and facilities has been specifically designed to meet critical needs in the community by connecting families, improving health, and impacting youth. The Y is dedicated to promoting character development values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility while we serve the residents of Volusia County.

All services of the Volusia Flagler Family YMCA Association are available to the public. Anyone can enjoy the YMCA whether it be through membership, by using a daily pass, or by enrolling in specific programs and activities.

The Shade structures at the playground and pool areas, will provide and enhance outdoor recreational opportunities for public use.

We are requesting ECHO funding to upgrade the playground and pool at the Ormond Beach YMCA with shade structures. Adding shade structures over the ECHO funded playground and pool are a perfect match for ECHO funding and will attract more people and enhance the experience of those who use the amenities. These amenities are further the goals of Resolution 2000-156 " to enhance the quality of life for its residents by providing environmental, cultural, historical and outdoor recreational opportunities."



We will upgrade our playground and pool to include a shade structure to provide protection from the sun and increase the time children and families can spend time on outdoor physical activity. These features are designed to enrich the opportunities for children and families to bond, learn and grow through play.

By adding the shade structures, we can expand the user group by attracting children and parents who may be more sensitive to the sun and heat. Past experience at other YMCAs has shown that by providing shade, usage and duration of usage at the pool have gone up in family use. We have seen increased use of splash pads as well when shade is provided.

The pool and the playground, like all services of the Volusia Flagler Family YMCA Association are available to the public during operating hours.

The Ormond Beach YMCA is open the following hours:

Mon – Thu: 5:00am – 8:00pm

Fri: 5:00am - 7:00pm Sat: 7:00am - 3:00pm Sun: 12:00pm - 4:00pm

The public can enjoy the playground and pool in several ways.

- 1. Be a part of our programs like Afterschool and Youth Sports
- 2. Siblings, relative and friends who come with the youth sport participant can use the playground.
- 3. Become a member of the Y.
- 4. Use the playground and pool for the day with the purchase of a day pass.

The YMCA does not turn anyone away for inability to pay. Each branch of the Volusia Flagler YMCA gives thousands of dollars each year in financial assistance to help those who cannot afford to pay attend programs and for memberships.

The Ormond Beach YMCA Aquatic and Park Project is a multi-phase project with construction beginning in 2014 and continuing until all additional funds are raised and all outdoor and indoor renovation and construction is completed.

With the help of an ECHO grant, the project was launched as we enlarged the pool and the surrounding pool deck providing for easier public access. With the help of loyal and generous donors, we were able to simultaneously complete additional portions of our project to include the fence, lights, and public entrance around the pool. The pool was reopened in August of 2015 and immediately provided a new user experience to an expanded group of users The last Sunday of every month, the pool is open to the public for open swimming with no fee. The Ormond Beach Y is also offering free water safety lessons to the public at least once per year and with the expanded pool we are able to accommodate a larger group of participants. We have also offered a free week of swim safety for community children and their parents, but this program has been temporarily suspended due to the pandemic and its impact on staffing.



Another unique component of the Ormond Beach Aquatic and Park Project, the Dog Park, located on the west side of the Ormond Beach YMCA property was completed in 2018 and opened to the public. It has attracted a whole new group of users as well as enhancing the experience for current Y users. We have hundreds of registered dog park users. There is no fee for normal use of the Dog Park but there is a small fee for a Y dog tag to identify which dogs have registered and show proof of shots.

In 2019, the Ormond Beach Y was awarded ECHO funds for the new splash pad and playground for the Ormond Beach Aquatic and Park Project. The splash pad was completed by the beginning of 2020 and the playground was completed earlier this year. The splash pad provides another water experience for young and old as well as for people of all abilities. It has enhanced the experience for families and young pool users. The playground was reconstructed with new, modern and sustainable play equipment where children of all ages can learn and play together. This grant application requests funding to attract even more users to both the playground and pool.

The playground shade structure will be 30 feet by 50 feet and cover two thirds of the playground area, including the monkey bars and climbing area. The slide structure has its own built in cover. The artificial turf and open play area is mostly shaded by a large oak tree. The pool shade structure will consist of three 20 foot by 40 foot pieces to cover a total area of 20 foot by 120 foot.

Encouraging physical activity and laying the groundwork for a healthy lifestyle is important for our children now more than ever. The 2020 State of Obesity report from the Trust for America's Health sadly reports that for the first time, US adult obesity rate is over 40%. Rates of childhood obesity are increasing as well with 19.3% of young people ages 2 to 19 having obesity. Forty years ago, the rate for young people with obesity was at only 5.5%.

The Trust for America's Health reports that being overweight or having obesity as a young person puts them at higher risk for having obesity and its related health risks as an adult. They also report that children are having earlier onset of what used to be considered adult conditions like hypertension and high cholesterol.

One of the steps in combating obesity, according to this Trust for America's health study is to make physical activity and the built environment safer and more accessible for all by making community spaces more conducive and safer for physical activity and encouraging outdoor play. The shade structures will enhance the safety of these spaces for physical activity available to any resident of Volusia County.

While Florida, with an adult obesity rate of 27%, is doing relatively well in comparison to other states, the rate for obese children ages 10-17 in Florida is the eighth highest in the country with 17.8% having obesity. Only 22.6% of children aged 6-17 in Florida report participating in 60 minutes of physical activity every day.

According to the Florida State Health Assessment of 2017, youth who partake in physical activity



have healthier hearts, stronger bones and muscles and a reduced risk of chronic diseases. The report also states that physical activity can reduce symptoms of anxiety and depression.

In an article by American Psychological Association titled How and Why to Get Children Moving Now, Melissa Santos, PHD, a pediatric psychologist at the University of Connecticut School of medicine and clinical director for the obesity clinic at Connecticut Children's Hospital says that encouraging children to move their bodies is important not only for physical health but for mental health and cognitive development. She says "There are so many benefits to exercise, and we keep discovering more. There's no part of a body that doesn't benefit from physical activity." The article also says that young people who exercise more have lower levels of depression, stress and psychological distress and higher levels of positive self-image, life satisfaction and psychological well-being. Additionally, regular exercise can improve behavior and help children pay attention more and have better long term academic performance. Children who are healthy and physically fit are more likely to graduate high school and go on to post high school education. They are more likely to continue their active health lifestyle into adulthood and be productive contributing members of our community.

These are some of the reasons that the YMCA has partnered with ECHO to bring quality outdoor recreation opportunities to the residents of Volusia County. Encouraging healthy living is one of the overarching goals of the YMCA. The new shade structures at Ormond Beach YMCA will provide safe and fun outdoor recreation for the children in Volusia County and will also encourage an active healthy lifestyle for children and families. It will be available to the public during YMCA operating hours.

When children and their supervisors are exposed to the sun for too long, they all feel the effects of being in the heat for extended periods of time. The shade structures will protect children from the sun and weather as well as help to lower the temperature of the playground and pool and improve the play experience for all who us it. The shade structures will be instrumental in helping our kids and their families enjoy their time outside and learn that play and physical activity can be fun. Our goal is to make physical activity and a healthy lifestyle a fun part of their life as they grow into adulthood.

A shade structure provides a permanent cooler and shaded area outside. It will encourage the program leaders to use the outdoor area more throughout their curriculum. The shade can also entice local families to use the playground and the pool and be more active with their families.

Most importantly, a shade structure provides protection from skin cancer for both the children and the adults supervising their play. Lucile Packard Children's Hospital at Stanford lists exposure to sunlight as the main factor for skin cancer. The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia also advises limiting exposure to the sun saying that the amount of time spent unprotected in the sun directly affects a child's risk of skin cancer. They report that the incidence of melanoma, the deadliest of skin cancers, is increasing by 2 percent in children each year. They also note that exposure to sunlight is the major contributing factor to developing skin cancer not only in children, but later in their life, reporting that blistering sunburns in childhood and adolescence significantly increase the risk of developing malignant melanoma later in life. The majority of skin cancers are basal cell carcinoma and occurs mainly on areas exposed to the sun such as the head,



neck, arms, hands, and face. Limiting exposure to sunlight in children and teens may pay large dividends in preventing skin cancers now and later in life.

A shade structure over the playground and pool at the Ormond Beach YMCA protects our Volusia County children, families and our staff while promoting an active and healthy lifestyle.

The Shade Structures at the Ormond Beach YMCA pool and playground will provide high quality, user oriented outdoor recreational opportunities.

The Volusia Flagler Family YMCA will have been serving the community for over 100 years! The Ormond Beach YMCA opened in 1989. We are a part of a highly respected national organization which has been meeting the needs of communities around the world for more than 160 years. Locally, the Yisheld in high regard by local governments, businesses, service organizations and the public. We are experts in providing fitness and recreational opportunities to our communities. The Ormond Beach Community Aquatic and Park Project is providing additional amenities to the community which will be offered, maintained, and sustained with the same professional and fiscally responsible practices as with all of our programs in the past.

The Y is unique in our focus on the family and our commitment to promoting youth development, healthy living, and social responsibility in everything we do. The project at the Ormond Beach Y is distinctive in that it offers an extensive array of recreational, exercise, education, and community activities all in one location. Programs and oversight are provided by trained professionals at all times. YMCA programs have always provided specific opportunities for people with different levels of physical abilities, including the stroke rehabilitation provided in partnership with Halifax Rehabilitation. While the Ormond Beach Community Aquatic and Park Project provides the most benefit to residents of Ormond Beach, all Volusia County residents are eligible to take advantage of all the new and exciting features we have added.

2. Describe the project and construction timeline.

Upon approval and release of funds, we will order the shade structures. We expect delivery time to be 2-3 months. The shade structure project should be totally completed in plenty of time to protect our children, families, and staff from the hot summer sun. Providing there are no delays in the manufacturer's supply chain, we expect to complete the project and have it open to the public by June 1, 2022.

Installing shade structures at the pool and playground at the Ormond Beach YMCA is an outdoor project and naturally incorporates green and sustainable standards. There will be insignificant impact on the natural resources and the construction will not require removing



any trees or plants. The shade structures meet all safety standards but are not constructed with recyclable materials.

The pool and playground at the Ormond Beach YMCA meet all ADA requirements and adding shade structures will not alter that compliance. This project, though, will allow for longer and safer play times for all users.

The YMCA acts as one member of the community of service providers whose goals are to improve the health and well-being of the residents of Volusia County. We study the outcomes posted by the United Way and other county and state agencies who focus on the health and well-being of our community, and we are striving, along with the other providers, to improve the statistics for our residents.



The site plan proposes to leave the existing encroachment and provide a landscape buffer from the end of the encroachment.

According to Mr. Antonich the County and City earlier provided \$150,000 each (total of \$300,000) because this was an affordable housing project. Additionally he stated that apparently \$200,000 in entitlements and site work (engineering, etc.) had been performed on the site leaving approximately \$1,200,000 of the sale price to the land. This equates to a price of \$13,636 per apartment unit, or \$3.66/SF of developed land area.

The site had 9.35 acres of wetlands, of which 2.14 AC are to be impacted. Reportedly, mitigation of these wetland impacts were by way of preserving on-site uplands. Additionally, 16.2 AC of the site is in a flood plain with flood zone compensation provided on site.

Only 7.52 AC were developed. The remainder of the site was either preserved wetlands (7.17 AC), preserved uplands (2.63 AC), mitigation for impacted wetlands, or used as compensating storage for flood zone impacts. Only 0.125 AC of bank credits (Lake Swamp Mitigation Bank) were needed for this project.

Staffing

Though adding shade structures will provide the ability for children to play and swim longer with less exposure to heat and sun, it will not affect the staffing level.

The Playground at the Ormond Beach YMCA is used by children in our KidZone, our licensed afterschool program, childcare, and summer camps. These programs provide a safe, nurturing environment for more than 600 children annually under the supervision of qualified, professional staff.

The Pool is used for swim team, competitive club and high school swim meets, lifeguard training, water aerobics, swim lessons and open swim. At least 5,000 people use the pool each year.

Outdoor play and physical activity are a part of all our children's programs. Having modern, accessible, and safe pool and play areas aimed at including children of all abilities to play, learn and grow together will benefit all the children attending these programs as well as other children who simply stop by to swim and play.

We maintain a child to staff ratio in our programs per Department of Children and Families regulations and add staff as needed when our participant numbers grow. Should the number of program participants grow, the costs of any additional staff will be offset by the participant fees for the program. No new programs for children are planned at this time.

While the playground is open to the public during all operating hours, it is staffed only when the afterschool or other children's programs are using them. The Volusia Flagler YMCA requires all children under 12 to be accompanied by an adult. The pool is staffed during all operating hours.

The Ormond Beach YMCA is open the following hours:

Mon - Thu: 5:00am - 8:00pm

Fri: 5:00am - 7:00pm Sat: 7:00am - 3:00pm Sun: 12:00pm - 4:00pm



Maintenance Requirements

The shade structure manufacturer provides a detailed maintenance plan and check list. Frequent inspection is an important part of this maintenance plan. Current maintenance and facilities staff will be trained to perform the inspection and make necessary adjustments as needed. We do not anticipate any additional staff needed to maintain the shade structures.

Fees

Use of the pool and playground are included with any regular membership fee, daily usage fee, preschool program fee or after school program fees. The playground is also included for athletes in our sports programs and their families when on premises for scheduled games and practices. No additional fees are charged for the playground.

YMCA Membership Fees

Membership is open to everyone in the community. One who has chosen to become a member of the Ormond Beach YMCA or any YMCA facility in the Volusia Flagler YMCA Association has full access to the pool and playground as well as the rest of the facility.

Anyone who is not a member can use the YMCA by being a part of our programs, accompanying youth sports participants to their games, or purchasing a daily pass.

Volusia Flagler Family YMCA has established a dual rate system for membership fees. Currently, this system includes the full price fees and rates based on scholarship. At this time, scholarship rates are available for people whose income is less than \$40,000. Depending on income, scholarship rates may discount pricing up to 50%. No one is every turned away from the YMCA for inability to pay.

The afterschool and summer camp programs are available to anyone in the community.

Detailed Maintenance and Replacement Plan

The Ormond Beach YMCA will maintain the shade structures to the same high standards that are applied throughout our facilities.

The equipment manufacturer provides a detailed maintenance plan and check list. When adjustments are necessary, the maintenance guide provides step by step instructions. The work will be done by current maintenance and ground staff at the YMCA and will result in no additional costs.

The manufacturer warranties all parts of the shade structures. Major components and fabric is warrantied for 10-20 years. With dedicated maintenance, we expect the shade structures to last well beyond that time to meet at least the 20 years required by the restrictive covenants.

As with all capital improvements and facility maintenance expenses, the YMCA budget



process includes a short term and long term plan for funding to guarantee that we meet our commitment to the restricted covenants of all of our ECHO projects. ECHO funded shade structures over the ECHO funded Ormond Beach playground and pool will serve the children and families of Volusia County for the 20 years required and for many years beyond that time.

Our daily participation numbers for our pool and playground demonstrate that adding shade structures will benefit large numbers of children and families who frequent the Y by encouraging more time spent in outdoor physical activity. Certainly, the added comfort and protection from the sun and heat will attract new pool and playground users as well.

3. Has this organization defaulted on any grant in the past five years? If yes, please explain.

The Volusia Flagler YMCA has rescinded 2 ECHO grants in the past. The Covid-19 pandemic was the main reason for rescinding these grants as companies and nonprofits around the world had to rethink their operations and futures and do whatever was necessary to sustain operations, staffing and services to clients.

Both projects were in the planning process and beginning construction when the virus hit in early 2020. Within 2 months, the Volusia Flagler YMCA lost 55% of their membership and the operational budget dropped by \$2.5 million in 2 months. The leadership of the Volusia Flagler YMCA was forced to focus on sustaining operations and ensuring that the organization could be there to serve the community when the virus slowed and the shut downs were over. As we all know, that lasted much longer than anyone initially expected and money that was earmarked for expansions and projects was needed for operations. Thankfully, because of the responsible staff and board leadership, the Volusia Flagler YMCA has survived. Membership is almost back to prepandemic levels. We can once again focus on making improvements to facilities and amenities to better serve Volusia County residents.

The following ECHO grants were rescinded:

- 2018 ECHO grant for \$400,000 to fund a fitness trail at the Ormond Beach YMCA and add gates, lighting, and cameras at the ECHO funded dog park
 - Matching funds were diverted to funding operations to sustain the organization through the pandemic. Subsequently, the Volusia Flagler YMCA has turned focus onto improvements to the current facility and may in the future look again at similar projects to further enhance the outdoor areas around the Ormond Beach YMCA.
- 2017 ECHO grant for \$77,750 to fund a playground at the DeLand YMCA
 - Matching funds for this project were temporarily diverted to operations during the beginning of the pandemic as the DeLand branch was in danger of closing due to the loss of membership and the funding that provides. When funds were later secured again for the playground, the equipment was delivered and was to arrive in time to meet the deadline that was extended by the ECHO committee upon our request. Due to the pandemic, the manufacturing and shipping times were drastically slower than stated by the manufacturer and the playground equipment did not arrive in time. That equipment order was therefore canceled, and we are applying again for the project.
